

Model States

MINNESOTA

Minnesota's Medical Assistance program reimburses:

1. **live video** for fee-for-service programs
2. services delivered through **store-and-forward technology**
3. **"telehomecare"** under Elderly Waiver (EW) and Alternative Care (AC) programs

CALIFORNIA

Medi-Cal will reimburse for:

1. services provided via **live video**
2. **store-and-forward services** (for tele-dermatology, tele-ophthalmology and teledentistry)

Private payers **cannot require** that in-person contact occur before payment is made for covered telehealth services

MISSISSIPPI

Health insurance plans **must provide coverage** for telemedicine services to the **same extent** as in-person consultations

Coverage must also be provided for **store-and-forward** and **remote patient monitoring** services.

MONTANA

Private payers are **required** to provide coverage for services delivered through telemedicine, **equivalent to in-person coverage**.

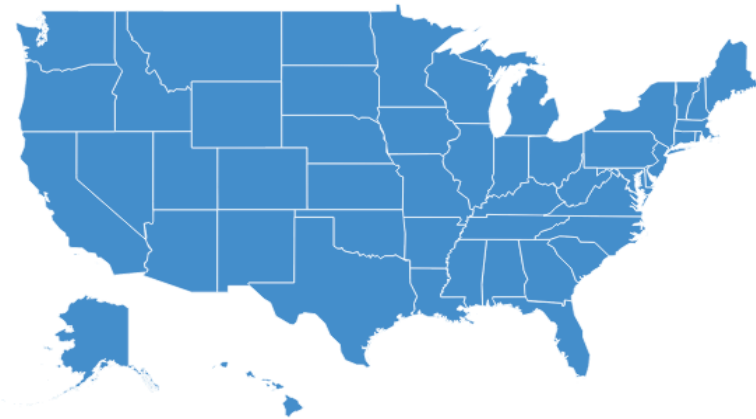
