In 2011 when AB 415, the Telehealth Advancement Act, was winding its way through the legislative process, an ad hoc group of statewide organizations supporting the bill formed. Including such groups as the California Primary Care Association, the California Hospital Association and the California Rural Health Association, these groups met in meetings convened by CCHP in order to be apprised of any developments around AB 415 and share information with each other.

With the successful passage of AB 415, the group continued to meet and eventually formed into the California Telehealth Policy Coalition. From a handful of organizations, the membership has grown to include over eighty-five entities

that include consumer groups, medical systems, payers, providers, technology representatives and others. CCHP continues to act as the convener of the Coalition and hosts monthly conference calls with continued support from the California Health Care Foundation in this work.



Medi-Cal Telehealth Policy Proposal Overview

- Payment parity for services via synchronous/real-time telehealth only
- New fee schedule and policies for asynchronous/store-and-forward, telephonic/audio-only, other virtual communication and RPM
 - Established patients only
 - Provider and service limitations
 - Unclear billing policies and reimbursement rates
- Eliminates FQHCs/RHCs site restrictions
- Limits FQHCs/RHCs to synchronous telehealth only
 - No audio-only or store-and-forward
- Limits plan ability to use telehealth to meet network adequacy requirements to synchronous modalities

Telehealth Policy Proposal - In Context

- Makes a few temporary allowances permanent
 - Eliminates FQHCs/RHCs site limitations
 - Targeted Care Management (TCM), Local Education Agency Medi-Cal Billing Option Program (LEA-BOP), State Plan Drug-Medi-Cal telehealth waivers and additions
 - Adds RPM
- Narrows ability to utilize telehealth further than pre-pandemic policies
 - Restricts/eliminates asynchronous
 - New "utilization management" policies
- Conflicts with existing laws
 - Establishing new patients limited to synchronous in Medi-Cal only
 - Payment parity for all telehealth private payors only

Telehealth Policy Proposal – In Comparison

PRE-COVID-19

Live Video & Store & Forward Reimbursed at parity; Provider chooses when appropriate to use. FQHC/RHC Limited use of both modalities

FQHCs/RHCs limited in where patient located at time of service. Home not eligible

No audio-only.

No RPM.

COVID-19

Live Video & Store & Forward Reimbursed at parity; Provider chooses when appropriate to use. FQHC/RHC allowed to use both modalities

FQHC/RHC home eligible originating site for all modalities

Audio-only reimbursed for services & parity

No RPM.

PROPOSED

Live Video reimbursed at parity; Store & Forward along w/audio-only, RPM and other modalities will be limited, pending DHCS policies. FQHC/RHC not allowed to use anything but Live Video

FQHC/RHC may only use Live Video to provide services in home

Audio-only treated in different category. Likely no parity.

RPM treated in different category. Likely no parity.

PROPOSED PERMANENT CHANGES

New proposals will make some aspects of telehealth policy in Medicaid narrower than what existed pre-pandemic.

RRE-proposals COVID Proposals in some respects move CA more towards approach taken by CMS in Medicare.
