

Description

Senate July 19, 2018, - Text of the Senate amendment to the House Bill for prevention and access to appropriate care and treatment of addiction (House, No. 4742) (being the text of Senate document numbered 2609, printed as amended)

Bill Summary: This bill would provide for the prevention and access to appropriate care and treatment of addiction. Among other items, it requires the executive office of health and human services to develop and implement a statewide program to provide remote consultations not less than five days a week to primary care practices, nurse practitioners and other providers who are providing care for persons experiencing chronic pain. The definition of "Behavioral health counseling" includes professionally administered interventions delivered in person or remotely via telemedicine.
